- Support for Early Education Rate Reserve (3000-1042) \$45M
- Support for Income-Eligible Child Care (3000-4060) Embed Early Education Workforce Personal Child Care \$20M

- Support for C3 Grants (3000-1045, 1596-2410) and Maintain Existing Tier Language -\$75M

- An Act to reduce poverty by expanding the EITC and the child and family tax credit filed by Senator Eldridge (<u>SD.1380</u>)
- An Act addressing the racial wealth gap *filed by Senator Paul Feeney, Representative Andres Vargas, and Treasurer Deborah Goldberg* (SD.2111, HD.2031, H.48)
- An Act establishing a diaper benefits pilot program *filed by Senator Joan Lovely*, *Representative Mindy Domb and Representative Simon Cataldo* (SD.1378, HD.2205)
- An Act requiring financial education in schools, filed by Senator Patrick M. O'Connor, Representative Kate Lipper-Garabedian, and Treasurer Deborah Goldberg (<u>SD</u>.1175, HD.931, H.46)
